

Pre - guide to the District Museum in Leszno

- or what you should know before visiting the Museum.

GET TO KNOW US

The District Museum in Leszno is a cultural institution of the Wielkopolska Voivodeship.

The museum has been collecting souvenirs

related to history, culture and art of Leszno, Greater Poland and Poland

for over seventy years.

The Museum is active through exhibition,

educational and publishing activities.

The Museum has housed a Painting Conservation

Workshop since 1976.

The District Museum in Leszno is located in two buildings.

You can visit the permanent and temporary exhibition at 31 Gabriela Narutowicza Street in Leszno, in the former synagogue building.

The Museum building is historic. It is over 300 years old.

The building is renovated and free of architectural barriers.

If you use a wheelchair, there is a driveway

in front of the entrance.

What can you see at the District Museum in Leszno?

You can see permanent and temporary exhibitions in the Museum.

Permanent exhibitions are those that do not change for several years.

Temporary exhibitions last shorter, for example, several months.

Permanent exhibition:

„At the meeting point of worlds. History of Leszno from the 16th to the 20th century”

is located in the large hall of the synagogue at 31 Gabriela Narutowicza Street in Leszno. Here you will see and learn about the history of Leszno from its beginnings to the mid-20th century, when the Museum was established.

GETTING THERE BY CAR

Behind the Museum building, on Powstańcy Square and on Gabriel Narutowicz Street, you will find paid municipal car park.

From Monday to Friday, however, there is a lot of traffic, so there aren't always available spaces.

GETTING THERE BY BUS

If you want to reach us by city bus from the railway station or bus station, you can choose bus line no. 6. It's worth getting off at the stop on Karol Marcinkowski Street, near the 1st Leszczyński Family High School.

Important: unfortunately, we do not have a dedicated parking space for the bus, but in the case of such a group, participants can get off at Tadeusz Kościuszko Square. During this time, the driver can, for example, park the vehicle in the parking lot on Józef Kustroń Street. This is the parking lot next to the viaduct in Leszno. After the tour, the driver will pick up the visitors in the same place where they got off.

VISITING DAYS AND HOURS

The Leszno District Museum is open to visitors from Tuesday to Sunday.

Tuesday is free admission day to the museum.

If you are very sensitive to light and sound, you can visit us during "quiet hours." Please call if you would like to schedule such a visit.

HOW TO ENTER ?

The building from Gabriela Narutowicza Street has two entrances.

If you are visiting our museum, head to the entrance on the right, where the information display is hung on the wall.

Go up three steps of stairs. Double doors separate you from the museum hall.

If you have mobility problems, you can also use our wheelchair free of charge. You will find it in the hall on the right as you enter the building.



TOILETS

Toilets are located on the ground floor. Right at the door entrance (on the left) there is a women's toilet.



The men's toilet is located after crossing the hall and going down the stairs (on the left).



Directly from the entrance to the museum you will also find a toilet for disabled people. You don't have to climb any stairs to get to it.

There's a string attached inside. When you pull it, a signal and a red light will turn on. Then we will know that you need help.



The toilet is also on the first floor, so there's no need to go downstairs when visiting the main hall.



CLOAKROOM

Entering the building, you will find lockers for personal items and coat hangers. Leave your outerwear there.

Remember to leave your food and drinks secured in the cloakroom.

There are also clothes hangers next to the men's toilet.

ELEVATOR

If you want to use the elevator, you will find it on the left after entering the building. It will take you to the ticket office and to the exhibitions.

Level 0 – when you are at the bottom of the building, i.e. when you entered the Museum

Level 1 - ticket office

Level 2 - permanent exhibition

Level 3 - temporary exhibition

TICKET OFFICE

Buy a ticket at the ticket office. Please keep it until the end of your visit to the Museum. You can also get free leaflets about the exhibition at the ticket office. If you need a magnifying glass, please ask the employee at the ticket office.



MUSEUM SHOP

In the Museum hall, where the ticket office is, there is also a museum shop. If you want to buy something from the shop, talk to a member of staff. Employees wear badges with name and surname.

INFO KIOSK

You will also find an info kiosk in the hall. The screen has a lot of settings and functions. For example, you can increase or decrease the letters or set the contrast of the image. Don't be afraid to ask the staff for help if you don't know something.



A PLACE OF REST

In the hall you can relax on comfortable sofas. If you have something to eat and drink, this is a good place to consume such things.



MUSEUM GUARD

In the hall you will see a security guard behind the glass. He is the one who looks after your safety at the Museum. You will also see cameras in our building. Don't be afraid of them, they are there to make the work of the guard easier, as they can see on the screens what is happening in and around the Museum.



EMERGENCY EXITS

There are two emergency exits in the hall.

HOW DO I GET TO THE EXHIBITIONS?

Head towards the stairs from the ticket office. Stairs with handrails lead to the exhibitions. First, there are seven steps down. Then the stairs lead up to the main hall. There are additional stairs leading to the temporary exhibition hall. Remember, however, that you can always take the elevator. You will be accompanied by a Museum employee when visiting exhibitions. Don't be afraid to ask him if you have any questions or problems.
